

Husband-wife team creates custom home

Roseville couple part of Street of Dreams

RANCHO MURIETA — The husband-wife team of Garen and Susan McCune of Roseville have built "The Chardonay," one of eight homes being featured in Rancho Murieta's Street of Dreams.

The 3,200 square-foot, three bedroom, three-bath home — "The Chardonay" — is priced at \$335,000.

The Street of Dreams is a month-long festival showcasing eight dream homes, all constructed on a single street in Rancho Murieta, the 3,500-acre country club community on Jackson Road, east of Sacramento.

McCune of GLM Custom Homes Inc. has been building homes for 10 years, including homes in Crown Point, Los Logos, Huntington Oaks, Johnson Ranch, and WoodBridge Ranch. He also developed Orchard Estates in Sacramento County.

GLM homes, including "The Chardonay," are designed by his wife, Susan McCune, who taught high school English before taking a class in drafting at Sierra College.

"The Chardonay" offers a taste-

ful mix of contemporary styling and old-world charm as depicted by a spacious family room with a wall of glass overlooking a courtyard and lake.

A library, furnished in leather, features a freestanding Country-English library wall.

The home also features a large brick fireplace wall; built-in entertainment center; large wet bar; and log storage for the living room fireplace.

The master suite is furnished with designs of the Orient and includes a private second-floor balcony, jacuzzi tub, and corner skylight window.

A country kitchen is equipped for the modern cook with an appliance center, walk-in pantry, work center with vegetable sink, and solarium window.

All bedrooms have walk-in closets. The girl's bedroom features a sleigh bed.

The interior of "The Chardonay" was designed by McCreery's Fin Furniture Inc. Landscaping was done by Ron Miller.
